Jeep Safari on a bumpy track takes you through lush green tea plantation and mountain valleys surrounded by hills, one can experience the visual treat, that's nature. Sights of the valleys in the distance are as beautiful as on the hills when weather is clear and is also one of the most thrilling experiences. Drive through Tea plantation ends in the woods and hike through forest zigzag terrain leads to beautiful clear stream flows through it like a shining silver ribbon. Take a dip in the serene cold natural waters in this picturesque spot .






## KURICHIYA TRIBES & FISHING (10 AM, 3.5 HOURS, MAX 6 PAX)


Meet the members of the Kurichiya tribe, Witness their collection of different tools and weapons, Learn to wield a bow or watch in awe as skilled hands make one. It is believed that the Kurichians, the warrior tribes, were the soldiers of King Pazhassi Raja in the guerilla warfare against the British. Walk through the village lush green paddy fields and the Trail ends at the local tribal house with natural lake where we are able to fish sitting on a country boat and get it Tava Fried in front of you, with local tapioca and chutney.





### THE KURICHYAR MALA MORNING TREK (7 AM ,4 HOURS , MAX 6 PAX)

Takes you through lush Tea Plantations as sand road zigzags up through. The route to Kurichyar Mala is through estate paths, with waterfall and clear streams on the way. It's a steep climb from the base area where tea hills line up and fog travels with you as wind waves with sights of the valleys in the distance are as beautiful as on the hills when weather is clear. The trek is about 5 to 6 km and is an easy one to do and can still be done by beginners with ease. All through your trek downwards, you will see the wonderous curves of the hills crowned by the beautiful morning mist.



# TEA TRAIL (8 AM: 2 HOURS, MAX 6 PAX)

Walk through Tea plantation, to the area where the day's pruning takes place, meet up with local tea picking women, get into their costume to try and prune a few bushes alongside them. Our next stop is at the factory, where one goes through the various stages of tea dust making. The processes of withering, rolling, oxidizing and drying can all be learned here. The Tea Museum, set up in an old tea plantation factory, makes for the perfect English tea experience. After a tour around the museum, complete with stories of history, variety and benefits of tea, we move to the much-awaited Tea Tasting session. This will allow you to understand all the differences between your white, black and green tea. Before you make your way back, there is a sale counter for you to pick up your favourite brew of tea from.
